A "JACK THE RIPPER" MURDER IN KENSINGTON.

Shortly before one o'clock on Monday morning the body of a woman was found by a passer-by lying on the pavement in a quiet portion of Holland-park-road, Kensington. A constable was summoned, and on examination it was found that the woman's throat had been cut, and that life was extinct. The constable raised an alarm, and assistance was quickly at hand. The body was carried to the police-station, about & quarter of a mile distance, where it was seen by Dr. Townsend, the divisional surgeon, who, finding his services were uselesss ordered its removal to the Ken-NOVEMBER 1894 noon the body was identified as that of Augusta Dudley, living at 36, St. Clement's-road, Notting dale. 
